


#### Measure & Background – Results WA

1.2.A.g: Reduce suicide death rate from the rate of 15.6 per 100,000 in 2015 to 14.0 per 100,000 in 2020






2012-2016 Washington State Suicide Mortality (State Age-Adjusted Rate = 14.9 per 100,000. ^=fewer than 10 deaths)




# Change in Number of Suicides by County (2007-2011 vs 2012-2016)



Note: Only counties with more than 30 deaths are included.



# Suicide Rate by Race/Ethnicity (2012-2016)



NHOPI: Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander

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
# Suicide Rate by Race/Ethnicity WA and US (2012-2016)

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# Change in Suicide Rate by Race/Ethnicity (2007-2011 vs 2012-2016)






# Suicide Rate (Number) by Age and Sex (2012-2016)



#### Rates (Number) of Hospitalization for Intentional Self-Harm by Age and Sex (2012-2016)



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

### Definitions

- Firearm: Intentional self-harm by handguns, rifle, shotgun, larger and unspecified firearm discharge.
   ICD-10 codes: X72 to X74
- <u>Suffocation</u>: Intentional self-harm by suffocation, hanging, strangulation.
  ICD-10 code: X70
- <u>Poisoning</u>: Intentional self-harm by prescription, non-prescription and illicit drugs, alcohol, organic solvents, gases/vapors, pesticides and other chemicals and noxious substances.
  ICD-10 codes: X60 to X69


### Methods of Suicide (2012-2016, 2017\*)

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
# Methods of Suicide- By Sex (2012-2016)






## Suicide Rate in Washington Ages 10-24 years old 2012-2016





## WA and US Rate of Suicide among MIMY (ages 35-64 years old)




## Suicide Methods Used among MIMY (35-64 years old) (2012-2016)





#### Trends of Top Methods Used among Older Adults (65 years and older) (2012-2016)







# Rate and Number of Suicides among AI/AN By Age (2012-2016)



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## Selected Population: Veterans

#### Overview

- In 2016, the VA estimates a total of 567,000 veterans in Washington state.
- Department of Defense reports 64,171 active duty military and reserve members.
- From 2012 to 2016, 1,165 veterans\* died by suicide.
  - This accounts for 21.5 % of all WA suicides.
  - o 36.7 % of veterans were ages 55 to 74.
  - o 240 veterans died by suicide in 2016 (crude rate\*\*: 38.0 per 100,000)

\* "Veterans" includes active service members, reserve members, and veterans.

\*\* Rate based on veterans.

#### 2017 Overview

- 1,247 suicides (age-adjusted rate=16.5 per 100,000) in 2017 compared to 1,123 (age-adjusted rate=14.9 per 100,000) in 2016.
- There is a +2.5% average annual percent change of suicide from 2006 through 2017.
- When comparing 2016 and 2017, most of the increases are seen in:
  o suicides by firearm and suffocation
  o youth and older age groups (65+ years old)
